Principals Report

What a year 2020 has been, I would first like to congratulate the students on the way they have handled the changes to learning due to the impact of Covid-19. Students handled the transition of learning from home and then returning to school extremely well. Covid-19 has had a huge impact on learning but since returning students have certainly made up for the time away from face to face learning.

Staff have shown their resilience and skill through learning how to teach via Zoom and building resources for students to use during home learning. The staff at Chalmers Road continued to teach those students that were onsite while teaching the students at home simultaneously. All members of the Chalmers Road School community should be commended in the undertaking of and self development of their skills in the use of technology for teaching and learning.

We proudly continued our involvement in Innovation Programs that gave our students a voice. Two of our Assistant Principals joined Professor Iva Strnadova from UNSW in creating a modified version of the Tell Them From Me Survey giving students with high support needs a voice about their schooling and how they feel about what is happening at school. Brooklyn and Natalie were participants in the creation of training videos for the Department of Education.

2020 also saw the implementation of the Student Café. Students were responsible for taking orders from staff, the collection and counting of money and then finally cooking the menu that Luke created each week. Students developed their understanding of kitchen safety, food preparation and developed their literacy skills through the reading and development of our weekly recipes. The students continually received positive feedback from all staff on the quality of the food and their positive attitudes during the café program.

Thank you to everyone who has participated in our Zooms celebrating our student and staff achievements throughout the

year. Your continued support and dedication to Chalmers Road School is greatly appreciated.

2021 will see two staff development days at the beginning of Term 1. Staff will return to school on Wednesday 27th January, with existing students to return to school on Friday January 29. All new students to Chalmers Road will commence school on Monday February 1st.
