


We are now all back at school in the classroom for the rest of the Term and ready for some fun learning experiences!

Orange Class have made wonderful efforts in contributing to online learning throughout the start of this term! Our students have been navigating through digital resources to continue their daily learning!





The Covid 19 isolation of students, their families and teachers from school produced a range of results and has given us plenty of examples of ways we can deliver education to our students.



## Cooking with Mr Luke


