Dear Parents and Carers

Order availability for parents:

Parents can order uniforms whenever they would like. They may select one of the below delivery options:

Delivery Option A (free delivery)

School delivery: In this option, we will deliver their order to Chalmers Road school, once in the middle of the school term, and once at the end of the school term. The order will then be sent home on cab with the students (or picked up by parents if they are picking the students up)

Delivery Option B (\$9.50)

Parents may order the uniforms to be delivered directly to any Sydney location that they require (this can be an office, or home address). We will dispatch the order within approximately 1 week from the order time to that address.
