Principals Report

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to all our students and a special welcome to our new students who have joined us at Chalmers Road School in 2023.

Students have transitioned to their new classes and are all working with their teachers and SLSOs as we begin our programs and developing students Personalised Learning and Support Plans. We look forward to seeing the parents and carers on 27 and 28 February for these meetings.

During the holidays improvement work has been undertaken throughout the school. Some work is still being completed.

The external fencing project with all our neighbours is nearly completed.

Junior School has an extended new veranda and undercover area that will be used for lunches, play and teaching space. The excavation to level the area is nearly completed, and synthetic grass will be installed.

Middle School- Two pods have been installed in the Middle School SPA and the area also has had synthetic grass laid. I'm sure the Pods will be very popular.

High School- we have continued the replacement of the wooden windows and doors with aluminium windows and doors.

Pool- It is wonderful to see the pool roof has been completed. The lights and retractable sides should be finalised in the next couple of weeks. In the heat the difference under the insulated pool roof will make swimming safer and more comfortable from the weather. We look forward to getting back to our swimming program.

Our first P and C meeting took place on Monday 13 February, we are working together to organise Parent Forums and fundraising for school projects. It was encouraging to see some

new parents attending and we encourage all our parents to join and participate. It is a good way to meet and connect with other parents and staff. The P and C meetings will continue each term with the Week 3 meeting commencing at 9.15 school/Zoom and Week 7 Zoom at 7pm.

Our amazing staff at Chalmers Road School are looking forward to an exciting year of learning with our students and we look forward to seeing our families at future Chalmers Road activities and events.






Swimming Nappies
