DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

What an incredible term we have had at Chalmers Road! With an average attendance of over 91% we have enjoyed seeing students every day, and the growth of all students across the school has been one of many highlights.

Throughout Semester 1 we have been and will continue to receive the assistance of three Social Work placement students from Western Sydney University. If you've been into the school, you may have seen Amina, Ashleigh and Klara assisting with a range of tasks, from working closely with students in classrooms, to developing resources

and supporting the leadership team. Our ongoing relationship with Western Sydney University is an incredibly important one, as it is essential Social Work students have a detailed understanding of the complex needs of our students and how they can best support families once they have completed their studies.

In Week 8 we successfully ran a parent information session open to all secondary families, with the assistance of Services Australia. This was a well-attended forum, and as always, the Services Australia team were extremely informative. Keep an eye out next term for information on another session by Intellectual Disability Rights Service as part of our post-school transition program for secondary families.

We are pleased to recommence out long-standing relationship with St Patrick's College Strathfield, and once a week have a contingent of boys join us to assist in out sports program with MiniFit. The St Pat's boys assist in our afternoon sessions with the secondary classes, and have already built strong friendships with our students, a highlight of the week!

As the term draws to a close, I want to wish all families a safe and restful break and look forward to seeing everyone back refreshed for Term 2.

Use the School Bytes Parent Portal App -


Send the school a message on the Schoolzine App, open the Absentee Tab on the app and send the school a message (see photo below).

It is a legal requirement that the school be notified as to why your child is away. You must apply to the principal for any school time holiday absence. If your child is unwell for more than two (2) days, then you will need to supply a doctor's certificate for this absence period in its entirety.

You will receive a phone call from the class teacher or Assistant Principal if these guidelines are not followed as we are legally responsible for the safety and whereabouts of all students.

Please keep students at home if they are unwell. Not having enough sleep isn't considered a justified reason for absence from school.

Green Class


